Key points from Donat Cattin <u>Letter</u> (1st december 1988)

- Homosexuals as a primary risk group
- Heterosexual families as the safest
- Undermining condom effectiveness and promoting abstinence
- Emphasizes chastity based based on Catholic rules and morals



Stigmatizing Campaign spot "Alone Viola" (1990)

And after over 30 years, where are we?

- 60% of people living with HIV in the survey reported fear of disclosing their status due to potential social and professional repercussions
- 75% of respondents believe that people living with HIV face significant discrimination in Italy
- Some people (-10%) would never sit close to a person living with HIV and would never drink from the same glass

A Recent Survey on HIV Stigma (Gay.it, 2022)

Healthcare System and HIV

- 500k people live in healthcare poverty
- Autonomous regional health systems create disparities in providing comprehensive HIV services
- National HIV Plan (2017) largely unimplemented
- Sexual education not mandatory
- Free contraception available in only few regions
- U=U officially agreed upon by the government in 2019

Italian community-based centers with regular services


HIV-STI Testing

- HIV tests are free in only infectious disease departments or with the exemption code.
 Family doctors are often unaware of this
- Other STI tests may not be. Only few regions offer full exemptions
- Limited availability of community-based HIV testing centers
- HIV tests can only be administered by healthcare providers and approved HIV associations



HIV data

- The annual number of tests performed is unknown, and there are no prevalence studies
- No specific data is available for trans and nonbinary people and sex workers
- No segmented data of migrants, jointly called "foreigners"
- Available data doesn't translate in effective changes



Plus has been rapidly responding to every HIV prevention innovation

First community-based PrEP point in Italy (Bologna) and another one in 2023 in Rome


In 2020 PrEP in Italia was established to

- Raise PrEP awareness
- Support PrEP users and those interested
- Address PrEP stigma within the LGBTQIA+ community



Multi channel dissemination and online peer counseling

- 4000 monthly web visits
- 20K annual reach on Instagram
- 200 annual emails and direct messages (Instagram, Facebook, Telegram) to support both potential and current PrEP users





- 30+ events in 3 years (online and in person)
- PrEP Camp with Plus Roma
- Alliance between people living with HIV and people on PrEP against discrimination and advocating for sexual rights




Community led monitoring

- PrEP centers online database
- Annual demographics on PrEP users and centers (2019-2022)
- Survey on LGBTQIA+ interest on CAB LA

In May 2023, free PrEP was finally approved, and in December 2023 the first <u>official online campaign</u> was launched by all HIV associations






There is still much to be done, but something has changed

From 500 users in 2019 to 11k users at the beginning of 2024

From 22 PrEP centers in 2019 to more than 80 in 2024

Future Challenges

Would Italy be ready to implement Prep CAB across regions?



Future Challenges

- Italian PrEP guidelines need to be revised: alignment with the WHO guidelines is needed
- Free PrEP can only be prescribed by an infectious disease clinic
- Bureaucratic and economic challenges
- Free PrEP should also means free STI tests
- Underrepresentation of women and other key populations on PrEP
